THE NATIONAL INDIAN COUNCIL ON AGING

National Indian Council on Aging, Inc. (NICOA) is a 501 (c)(3) not-for-profit, charity, membership and service organization founded in 1976. Our Mission is to advocate for improved comprehensive health, social services and economic well-being of American Indian and Alaska Native (Al/AN) Elders. NICOA provides testimony before federal, state and tribal policy makers on behalf of older American Indians. The board is comprised of 13 Al/AN Elders representing regions from across the continental U.S. and Alaska. The membership meet biennially to elect new board members and to establish the NICOA aging policy agenda. The additional purpose of the biennial meeting is to educate and recommend solutions to policy makers to help improve aging services across Indian Country.

NICOA was founded in 1976 in Phoenix, AZ by members of the Tribal Chairman's Association. Late Honorable, Wendell Chino, was the driving force behind the first NICOA Conference on Aging. Mr. Chino served as the President of the Mescalero Apache Tribe of New Mexico, and the Chairman of the Tribal Chairman's Association, and also served as the Honorary Chairman of the National Indian Council on Aging. His eloquent, inspirational speech calling for action on behalf of Al/AN Elders was the motivation for the creation of NICOA. The theme of the first NICOA conference was "The Indian Elder: A Forgotten American". This conference assembled 1500 Elders from 171 Tribes.

NICOA's goal is to raise \$300,000 to provide AI/AN Elders with a forum to voice their needs as they advocate for services to help them age safely in their own homes and in their own communities. Elders and stakeholders will receive valuable information and resources that can help improve their health, social services, and economic wellbeing. We are the only national organization authorized by AI/AN Elders to coordinate the NICOA Biennial Meeting as a forum to recommend solutions for improving aging services across Indian Country.

CONFERENCE DETAILS

For the past 38 years, NICOA has hosted 19 biennial conferences to advocate for improved aging services for older American Elders. This year, NICOA invites you to be a part of the 20th Biennial NICOA Conference experience.

NICOA represents over 784,502* American Indian and Alaska Native Elders across the continental United States and Alaska, 55 and older. NICOA Biennial conference attendees are 1,500-2,000 Al/AN elders, stakeholders and aging network providers. Our voting member Elders actively participate in 12 NICOA caucus sessions representing each of the 12 NICOA regions; participate in the election of board members; submit aging specific resolutions; revise bylaws; and develop a collective aging policy agenda for NICOA to advocate for in Washington, DC.

Advocacy & Education

The conference is the Elders' forum; the place to voice concerns and to receive up to date information and resources to help Elders age at home and in their own communities. NICOA works closely with the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services and the Department of Labor to advocate for grant funded programs and services such as Title VI Services for Native Americans (OAA Title VI), Indian Health Services, Medicare/Medicaid, Social Security, Senior Community Service Employment Program and others. NICOA members provide recommendations on policies that are important to aging older Indians such as the Affordable Care Act/Indian Healthcare Improvement Act, Older Americans Act, Community Service Employment for Older Americans – (AOA Title V), to mention only a few. Officials from Federal, State and Tribal services and departments are invited to listen, learn and share in the discussion about the successes and concerns impacting aging in Indian Country.

Keynote speakers from Federal, State and Tribal programs and departments will be present to provide program updates and listen to the aging needs of Al/AN Elders. Informational workshops will be provided by service providers and Aging Network professionals with experience in providing services to Al/AN Elders. The workshop sessions include caregiver support, health, nutrition, transportation, disease prevention, Long Term Care, employment and training, financial assistance, and much more.
